Re Official Information Request – Hospital admissions for opioid use, abuse, overdose

I refer to your official information request of 27 March 2019 and extended to 8 May, 2019 for the following information:

- 1. What is the number of hospital admissions for opioid and opiate use, abuse or overdose, annually, since 2015?
- 2. Could you please provide me, if possible, with the age, sex and ethnicity for each of these patients?
- 3. Does the DHB provide any help for those addicted to opioids or opiates, such as recovery programmes? If so, can you please provide details of these programmes, as well as the current number of people enrolled in your region?
- 4. Does the DHB keep records of opiate and opioid prescription rates i.e. how many times these are being prescribed on an annual basis in your region?
- 5. If so, can you please provide me with the number of times opiates and opioids are prescribed on an annual basis, since 2015?
- 6. Could you please include which opiates and opioids are being prescribed?

Part of the information you have requested is enclosed. Information you requested relating to help provided by the DHB for those addicted to opioids or opiates was transferred to Waitemata HB who are responsible for managing regional CADs services for Auckland. We notified you under section 14 of that decision.

The information we have released to you is enclosed.

Your reference to prescriptions in questions four to six would best be answered by seeking dispensing data from community pharmacies. Opioid dispensing rates (i.e. what patients obtain) are collected nationally and data is available and supplied publicly by the Health Quality and safety Commission on:

All major opioid outpatient prescriptions are on controlled scripts and a manual audit would be required to interpret trends. Our response is to refuse this part of your question under section 18(f) in that providing an answer would require extensive research.
